me, except the Father which sent me draw him' (John 6:44 *RV*). Sounds like God is quite selective in whom He invites to join His Family!

Yet we know that He '...is longsuffering to you-ward, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance' (II Peter 3:9). God's purpose in creating the material universe-and all in it-is to "...bring many sons to glory", to share in His spiritual Kingdom, His Family. And all of us are invited.

Wrote the apostle Paul of the Gospel: '...their sound went into all the earth, and their words unto the ends of the world' (Romans 10:18). In the first flush of the Gospel, the good • news of salvation was offered far

and wide, indiscriminately to all races, all colours. And no less so in our day.

Why, then, do so few accept the invitation?

> Do You Know if You Are 'Called'?

Millions confess to be 'Christian' by virtue of their birth into a Chris-

tian family. Any calling falls on deaf ears. But there are other factors blocking a response:

• In the first place, the cultural norm is that we inhabit a near godless society. For a couple of centuries there has been an outright assault on the Bible and its timeless values, with God faded into the background. The apostle Peter speaks clearly: '... And many shall follow their pernicious ways; by reason of whom the way of truth shall be evil spoken of' (II Peter 2:2)

'Godless', though, is inaccurate—for '... if our gospel is

veiled, it is veiled in them that are perishing: in whom the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving, that the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should not dawn upon them' (II Corinthians 4:4). Our society—its economic, social, legal, educational and even religious systems-is saturated with the evil principles of '... the god of this world'

- Further, the Gospel message-though opposed by many-was initially accepted by thousands of those who heard. Their background was exclusively first-century Judaism, and those Gentiles who embraced Judaism, 'proselytes'. They lived and breathed the Jewish way of life with all its worship forms. Their major obstacle was that they had to accept that Jesus was the Christ, the longpromised Messiah, that ritual was replaced by his sacrificial death
- Contrast that with potential • believers today. Christianity is associated with Sunday observance, with Easter, with Christmas. These practices were unknowns to the first Christians—and were never meant to be introduced. Indeed were counselled against-by none less than the LORD. So, today, when faced by the real

Scripture teachings the majority reject the invitation, choosing to stay securely in the arms of the world

- Some will take tentative steps towards conversion—for example through the *Alpha Course* or other evangelistic outreach. They come to belief in Jesus as Saviour, but draw up short when they face the hurdle of true Bible teaching
- In general, those likely to respond are those with needs the successful see no need for God. We are not called because of our wisdom or our power or our family connections, says Paul, but solely by His gracious intervention in our lives (I Corinthians 1:26f). But why does God 'choose'? Why distinguish one above another, whether nation or individual?

Chosen With Purpose

All that the sovereign God does is within the parameters of His grand design, His purpose for his *kosmos*. Abraham is an example (Joshua 24:3), as is Jacob (Romans 9:13). The nation of Israel was also chosen: *...the LORD hath chosen Jacob unto himself, and Israel for his peculiar treasure'* (Psalm 135:4). The Father exercises His sovereign will, noting national and individual character.

Christians, too, are 'chosen': '...you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people', wrote Peter to the brethren (I Peter 2:9).

But His choice isn't arbitrary. Note the words of Jeremiah, addressing the erring Israelites—and equally applicable to everyone: '...And you shall seek Me, and find Me, when you shall search for Me with all your

heart' (Jeremiah 29:13).

So, be aware of your need for forgiveness and mercy and then seek Him—the only source for the means of reconciliation, Jesus.

God's Foreknowledge

Down the centuries monumental effort has been expended by individual Christians—even to the point of death—to reach out with the Gospel. They sought to persuade—an effort to change minds, to convince. But if God has pre-determined some to be saved, why bother?

Wrote the apostle Paul to the Ephesian brethren: '... even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world' (ch 1:4). Not, note, chosen to be saved but '...that we should be holy and without blemish before him in love'. That we should, in other words, come to be like Him, to acquire the 'family resemblance' in our character—the image of Jesus His Son.

Paul adds: '...For whom he foreknew, he also foreordained to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren' (Romans 8:29).

Those, note, whom He —'foreknew'.

The Future is Real

To God, the future is as much a reality as the past and the present! He is the 'I AM' (Exodus 3:14). He is '...the same yesterday, today, and forever' (Hebrews 13:8), and He '...inhabits eternity' (Isaiah 57:15). The Creator lives outside time.

In our human form we are mere clay, created from the common elements of the soil beneath our feet: '...now, O LORD, you are our father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; and we all are the work of thy hand' (Isaiah 64:8).

The Image of Christ

The Bulls and the Bears

As is usually the case, the argument is not what the argument is about. In other words, the discussion today is about finances but the problem is the just, holy, temperate. economy. Now we must answer the question: what are we really talking about when we talk about "the economy?"

Stock market reports and trends, economic growth tracking, and things like inflation rates are merely charts of your portfolio or the bills in your wallet but it's an excellent barometer of the activities and health of the means' or 'the means justify the end'. als, water, land, fuels, were there nation - and your own.

Economics is really very broad yet quite simple. Let's see what we can discover. First, let's understand what we are talking about; economics is not just about money. It is about all those things that really drive, for good or for bad, the wealth and health of the nation and, for that matter, your own welfare.

What is economics?

Many words can be combined to make another new word. The Greeks did this by joining oikous, which means house, with *nomous*, meaning manager. This compound word, oikonomos, literally means 'manager of the house' and is where we get our word "economics," it even sounds similar.

Now a "manager of the house" certainly manages finances as in Luke 16:1 (steward) and Romans 16:23 (chamberlain). But, more impor-

If you can't be trustworthy in today's unrighteous economic times, how can God trust you with the true riches tomorrow?

Monetary health is merely a reflection of the qualities of those things that drive the economic engine; production, honesty, self-control, sobriety, etc. You may have to adjust your spending and saving habits to fit the changing economic climate . You, men and women, may even have to change your economy, the way you manage your house, business, or your children to adjust to God's economy. If your managerial skills are in order, the financial foundations are secure. So let's strive to get our economic house in order; the financial blessings will follow. Ω

Do 'Christian' nations need the ultimate penalty- death?

Violent dictators and murderers have stalked the earth at least since Cain and Nimrod thousands of years ago. Perhaps most - but certainly not all have escaped the hangman's noose. Some - like Mussolini - have met a grizzly end at the hands of their once oppressed subjects.

King Nebuchadnezzar (he ruled the area known today as Iraq in the sixth century BC) for his sins was literally turned out to pasture and lived like an animal for seven years. Saddam Hussein believed he was the reincarnation of that ancient king - and spent half a billion dollars rebuilding in his image. He was executed.

The 'chattering classes' of today's world are horrified when such wicked men swing. Should Christians be equally horrified? Is the death penalty for heinous crime contrary to Christian principle?

The premature death of any human being is tragic - a child torn from loving parents, an accidental death, a life taken by violent hands. A memorial service for someone with a fine reputation built over years of dedicated endeavour is a cause for celebration. As King Solomon wrote: 'A good name is better than precious oil; and the day of death, than the day of one's birth (Ecclesiastes 7:1). But what of 'the wicked'?

What of a callous killer or one of those violent dictators? Society recognizes that in the interests of justice and security such should be removed from opportunity to kill again. The *sentence* is what is in dispute, and as often as not it is an all-too-short term in prison, with unrepentant murderers, paedophiles and rapists back on the streets seemingly in no time. It is evident that 'rehabilitation' rarely works. What do the Christian Scriptures teach us about 'crime and punishment' - especially of violent killers, child abusers and rapists?

Life for Life

Opinion makers—and not least Christian opinion makers including the leaders of the Anglican and Roman churches—lobby vigorously for an end to 'capital punishment', the death penalty. One English Bishop calls it 'humiliating'. Political leaders create 'collateral damage'—*ie*, civilian deaths— in their often unnecessary 'just' wars but hypocritically reject the death penalty. They won't rest until it is banned in every nation.

For such, the imposition of death for murder or rape is seen as a reversion to barbarous 'Old Testament' practice. The implication is that it is obsolete and that we are now 'more civilized'. That despite the Government-approved annual mass slaughter of the as yet unborn.

Every civilised nation has its criminal justice code, and surely not even the most spiritual of any faith would doubt its necessity. Totalitarian governments may multiply laws to the point of tedium and frustration (for us), seeking to control every aspect of life—but the need for a penal code is all too obvious.

Divine Image

And death for serious offences is indeed a law found in the Old Testa-

ment: 'Whoso sheds man's blood, by man shall his blood be shed' was decreed by God in man's earliest days. (And that was centuries before Moses)

And why? 'For in the image of God made he man' (Genesis 9:6). They are God's words, His prescription for orderly human society. Israel's justice system built on this, with death for a number of crimes against the person. Government failure to deal properly with crime in accord with Biblical teaching leads to the breakdown of society (Ezra 7:25-26, Ecclesiastes 8:11)

God alone has the authority to take a human life—or to delegate that responsibility to appointed judges:

The 'Ten Commandments' provide the foundation principles for all such codes, as they were for ancient Israel's Constitution. Very few rulers would deny them a place, and the Christian Scriptures are no exception. As the apostle Paul states - it is God who has delegated this obligation to mankind.

His reference, of course, is to normal civilised government - not to the psychopathic despot who murders and tortures his own citizens. Vengeance indeed belongs to God, and Romans 13 tells us *how* the wrath of God is poured out on the ungodly! It is done through His appointed agents -- His "ministers" -- who do not bear the sword in vain.

'....'Let every soul be subject to the higher powers. For there is no power but of God: the powers that be are ordained of God. Whosoever therefore resists the power, resists the ordinance of God: and they that resist shall receive to themselves damnation. For rulers are not a terror to good works, but to the evil. Will thou then not be afraid of the power? do that which is good, and thou shall have praise of the same: For he is the minister of God to you for good. But if you do that which is evil, be afraid; for he bears not the sword in vain: for he is the minister of God, a revenger to execute wrath upon him that does evil' (Romans 13:1-4)

The Bible perfectly reflects human nature. God's Word recognizes that most of us are in general lawabiding and supportive of our criminal laws (they are for our personal benefit) needing only a general statement of what is and is not permissible.—but coupled with an assurance that justice will be done by the appointed authorities.

The Bible also recognizes that there are 'the wicked', and has imparted the authority to appoint judges to pass appropriate sentences on the law-breaker. Exodus 20-23 provides examples of even-handed justice and natural equity.

The New Testament also reflects the necessity of the ancient Law.

Wrote the apostle Paul: '...We know that the Law is good, if it is used in the right way. We also understand that it wasn't given to control people who please God, but to control lawbreakers, criminals, godless people, and sinners. It is for wicked and evil people, and for murderers, who would even kill their own parents. The Law was written for people who are sexual perverts or who live as homosexuals or are kidnappers or liars or won't tell the truth in court. It is for anything else that opposes the correct teaching of the good news that the glorious and wonderful God has given me. (I Timothy 1:9-11 CEV).

> Because sentence against an evil work is not executed speedily, therefore the heart of the sons of men is fully set in them to do evil (Ecclesiastes 8:11)

The divine Law includes the ultimate penalty—death—for some such offences.

The same Law also builds in the option of mercy in appropriate circumstances at the discretion of the judge, who - whether he understands it or not - is answerable to God.

Crimes against the person - murder, rape, kidnap, sexual deviation, filial violence and disrespect *etc* - merit the ultimate penalty, death. These defile the very image of God in man and are, in God's eyes, the greatest of all crimes and must be publicly seen as such.

Carried out by the State capital punishment deters personal vengeance, revenge, blood feuds - and removes the wicked from the earth until resurrected for judgment (John 5:28-29).

To reject capital punishment, with appropriate safeguards, flies in the face of the teachings of Scripture. Those who embrace true Biblical Christianity are few among Earth's billions. As wrote Paul, they are lawabiding. But society in general requires the rule of law with appropriate penalties—up to and including the hangman's noose. It is God's remedy—anciently and for every age.

Water it down, ignore divine wisdom, and we are doomed to experience a broken society. Ω

Why Britain is 'Broken'

It doesn't take a spiritual giant to observe the parlous state of our world and, notably of Great Britain.

On a 'table of nations' we fail lamentably. Britain is tops for drunkeness especially among the young. Tops, too, in teen promiscuity, STDs and pregnancies. Add in child murders, abortions—around 200,000 annually—greed and corruption in national political leadership, in business and in the world of finance. Then there's the filth foisted on us daily in the media. (And don't we lap it up!)

Britain, of course, has never been perfect. But check the appalling standards of education, the destruction of family life, the broken marriages, feral youth. The decline in national standards is clear. Urgently, we need to ask, *why*?

Sadly, it's the 'frog in the pan' syndrome. The decline has, for decades, been creeping inexorably upwards —widely unnoticed except by a few

secular prophets.

Belief Ancient and Modern

It is a truism that there has been a decline in Western Christianity since World War II. A weak Church has been overcome by the secular tide, eclipsed by a flood of alien religions—and even welcomes them.

Our situation parallels that of the dying days of ancient Judah. Then, idolatrous practices swept aside the true faith, descending even to human sacrifice. It merited the just judgment of the Creator. His protection was removed, leading to national exile in Babylon. As today, the leadership despised the true faith and embraced foreign imported religions labelled 'an abomination' by God.

Bad enough that in Christianity Sunday

has long replaced the divinely-ordained seventh-day Sabbath. Now, in the name of ecumenism, the church embraces these foreign faiths, welcoming them as equal partners in the worship of the God whose name is *Jealous* (Exodus 34:14).

Decline—and Fall?

It is generally rejected, but the true cause of our precipitous decline lies in the rejection of true religion. Together with a few other nations, Great Britain has inherited the mantle of ancient Israel. We have been the recipients of unbounded and undeserved divine blessing but have exhausted the treasure-house of divine favour—and, perhaps, His patience. His support has been withdrawn.

Key to the blessing is adherence to the '...*faith once delivered to the saints*'. Israel abandoned it for the false faiths of surrounding nations—and indeed imported them to Britain, as exemplified by the ancient Druids. The coming of Christianity to these shores *cont'd .p.8*

Why this on-going failure to lead the nations to a lasting peace?

Honest appraisal of man's attempts to produce lasting peace leads only to despair. We all want it. We try our utmost to achieve it—negotiation, trade, treaties, war, political union. But somehow every 'peace process' sooner or later crashes off the tracks. It reflects God's observation of human nature: '...The way to peace they have not known' (Romans 3:17). Permanent peace will, however, come. But the process will not be easy.

Heart Change

Central to the process is human nature. To be precise—a change of that nature, and that's a project the Creator has been working on for thousands of years. You might think He could just impose it by divine fiat. Zap us into submission. But haven't we ourselves learned that doesn't work? Think slavery. Think communism or fascism. Think, even, of certain religious sects.

Real lasting peace requires cooperation and a willingness to pay Pivotal to that plan is the return of the price. Jesus spoke of two ways-a broad one along which flows the vast tide of humanity, and a narrow and difficult one along which few pass. He said: '... Go in through the narrow gate. The gate to destruction is wide, and the road that leads there is easy to follow. A lot of people go through that gate. But the gate to life is very narrow. The road that leads there is so hard to follow that only a few people find it' (Matthew 7: 13-14 CEV). Man has from the begin-

ning cho-The Pathway to Peace sen the first, and

it leads inevitably to destruction of every high-minded aspiration we may have.

The key is transformationchange at the very core of our being. We can of ourselves tweak our personality and character to a degree, but radical root and branch change is a divine act by which God implants in us His nature, His Spirit. But only in the willing, in those who find and walk that narrow way.

Ambassadors of Peace

That's the same path walked by a select few from the beginning. and it is these whom God is preparing as His ambassadors of peace. The Father has set a time limit—its expiry date He alone will determine (Acts 1:7)-on human activity, and has outlined for us in the Scriptures of truth what has been called 'the crisis at the close'. Men may scoff (II Peter 3:3-4), but that plan will unfold as surely as day follows night.

the risen Christ. At that time all those who through the ages have followed the narrow way, and remained faithful-"...called and chosen and faithful'-will burst from their graves in spirit form to serve with Him the cause of true peace. People of faith such as Abraham and Sarah (eg Luke 13:28, Hebrews 11). The apostle Paul describes it: '...So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption: it is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is

sown in weakness: it is raised in power: it is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body' (I Corinthians 15:42-44). And they *...will be priests of God and of* Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years' (Revelation 20:6).

These faithful from every ageincluding our own-are destined to work with Jesus as 'kings and priests': '...you let them become kings and serve God as priests. and they will rule on earth' (Revelation 5:10 CEV). No longer material flesh and blood but now in new spirit bodies.

Traumatic Birth Pains

Those 'thousand years' will be a time of unprecedented peace and prosperity, mankind at last at rest. The birth of that new age, however, will be traumatic. Faced by the prospect of execution at the hands of a world-ruling despot, billions will choose to worship him-the conscious rejection of God's call to repentance. Billions will perish (eg Revelation 9:21).

A remnant from all nations, however, will heed and be led by the returning King of kings into a new life to re-build the devastated earth, supervised by God's army of Spirit-born saints and angels: '... And they shall build the old wastes, they shall raise up the former desolations, and they shall repair the waste cities' (Isaiah 61:4). They—men and women from all nationalities—will live out their physical life on earth, but now with changed priorities as they serve the King and repopulate and re-build the planet guided by Jesus and the now resurrected and immortal saints from all ages.

Having resisted the reigning world dictator in those 'last days', they will turn to the LORD despite horrific persecution. He says: '...Here is the new agreement [covenant] that I, the LORD, will make with the people of Israel: "I will write my laws on their hearts and minds. I will be their God, and they will be my people"' (Jeremiah 31:33 CEV). Over ensuing generations earth will be transformed to its pristine state. The Gospel will be proclaimed, and God's perfect Law will ensure peace and prosperity for all:

'...And it shall come to pass in the last days, that the mountain of the LORD'S house shall be established in the top of the mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow unto it. And many people shall go and say, Come and let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; and he will teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go forth the law, and the word of the LORD from Jerusalem. And he shall judge among the nations, and shall rebuke many people: and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruninghooks: nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more' (Isaiah 2:2-4).

Some such-descendants of the Israelites-will be led by the returning Christ into Palestine: '... Trees will grow on you mountains of Israel and produce fruit for my people, because they will soon come home. I will take care of you by plowing your soil and planting crops on your fertile slopes. *The people of Israel will return and* rebuild your ruined towns and live in them. Children will be born, and animals will give birth to their young. You will no longer be deserted as you are now, but you will be covered with people and treated better than ever. Then you will know that I am the LORD. I will bring my

people Israel home' (Ezekiel 36:8-12 *nations that attacked Jerusalem will go CEV*).

But notice also that Isaiah includes '...*all nations*' in this new era—the 'Gentiles'.

Traumatized by the events at the 'time of the end' and with their populations decimated the remnant will– for the most part—gladly turn to the King of kings, willingly submitting to His rule. Note that God gives a warning should they refuse Him: '...Afterwards, the survivors from those

For further explanation request Tabernacles: mankind in the flesh God's End-time Plan nations that attacked Jerusalem will go there each year to worship the King, the LORD All-Powerful, and to celebrate the Festival of Shelters [Tabernacles]. No rain will fall on the land of anyone in any country who refuses to go to Jerusalem to

—however distorted—became the foundation of our generally equitable and just society.

That foundation is fast crumbling. Without God's supportive intervention we are assailed by insoluble challenges. We struggle economically. We struggle on the battlefield. We struggle in face of widespread ill-health, sexual perversion, unwise, lying and ineffective leadership.

Be Strong

Faithful Christians daily face a sea of disbelief throughout society. It's vital that we stand firmly anchored to the Rock that is Christ, doing the Father's will, resisting the temptations that beset us. For the prize is to those who remain faithful, who '...*overcome to the end*'.

Having committed our lives to Jesus and 'The Way', salvation is ours: '...*now* are we the sons of God' (I John 3:2). With God's Spirit indwelling Christians, we are even now inducted into the divine Family. None but ourselves can take that away! Ω

Why the Holy Days?

'Don't suppose that I came to do away with the Law and the Prophets. I did not come to do away with them, but to give them their full meaning' (Matthew 5:17 CEV)

Whether Christian, Jew, Muslim or Hindu believers love their annual holy days. Christmas, Passover, Ramadan/Eid, Divali - all are joyfully celebrated by the faithful. (It is said that the atheist holy day is April 1st!) They mark special events and are believed to have been decreed by their respective God. Why do many an increasing number of Christians observe what are widely viewed as 'Jewish days'?

- The Bible holy days are listed in Leviticus 23, and are observed annually by thousands of Christian believers. Indeed they are the only days recorded in the Scriptures - Old Testament or New - to have been decreed by the God of the Bible, JHVH, the LORD, and observed by the first Christians
- Although considered (often disparagingly) as 'Jewish' these annual holy days were introduced to the new nation of Israel (c. 1500 BC) as '...appointed seasons of Jehovah, holy gatherings which you shall proclaim in their appointed seasons' (Leviticus 23:4). God's days, note not 'Jewish', not traditions concocted by mankind!
- Perhaps surprisingly, only one of the days observed in modern Christianity *Pentecost* (also called *Whitsunday*) is mentioned in the New Testament. Others (Christmas, Easter, saints' days *etc*) were imported from dubious sources into Christianity long after the time of Jesus and the apostles. They obscure the Creator's plan for mankind
- Each of these 'appointed seasons' has direct reference to and clarifies some aspect of the life and mission of Jesus Christ. They are 'shadows' cast by the real events they portray. Passover, for example, is a reminder of the LORD's deliverance of His people anciently from Egypt and, now, from the slavery of our sin. The Unleavened Bread festival emphasises our continuing need to live a holy life free from hypocrisy and error. Pentecost is the on-going mission of the holy Spirit through the church. The Day of Trumpets has direct reference to the tumultuous time just prior to the return of Messiah, while Atonement looks forward to the reconciliation of mankind with the Father. The seven-day Festival of Tabernacles depicts man's temporal nature an ever-present reminder of our frailty, that we are 'clay' being shaped for perfection by a loving God, while the eighth day looks forward to eternity
- As with the weekly Sabbath, in observing these divinely-appointed days '...there is great reward' (Psalm 19:8-11), and our annual observance reinforces God's Word to us. They provide 'food in due season'
- The holy days were appointed by God. So *must* we observe them? In ancient Israel they were indeed required observances though often neglected. Certainly important, for King Jeroboam self-servingly set up an idolatrous festival (I Kings 12:32) and was ever after branded as perhaps their most sinful king:'...*he made Israel to sin'*. (*ch* 14:16). God expected their observance so long as all else was in order, and done from the right motives. As Christians no amount of law-keeping will save only the sacrifice of Jesus, freely embraced, can do that. But as Christians we '...*live by every word of God'* as magnified by the teachings of Jesus, and we '...*worship in spirit and in truth'*. We joyfully do what God says—it is for our eternal benefit
- It is said of Abraham '...*the father of us all'* that he '...*kept my charge, my commandments, my statutes, and my laws'* (Genesis 26:5). This was some four centuries *before* Moses and 'the Law'. He obeyed as should Christians because of his faith, not because the Law demanded it. The festivals are '*statutes' eg* Leviticus 23:21. (There are indications that the three harvest festival seasons were observed from creation)

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
